#### The Book of Lamentations

## 5

#### **Morning Devotions**

Select a passage in God's Word. Talk with the Lord as you read the passage, then go back and find one or two verses which the Lord has impressed on your heart and meditate on them.

#### **Morning Study**

This morning we finish studying the book of **Jeremiah** – this time reading **chapters 39-52**. This section of **Jeremiah** is mainly historical – the fulfillment of his prophecies concerning the seige and downfall of Jerusalem. We can see this in the very first verse of **chapter 39**:

"This is how Jerusalem was taken..."

Although this last section acts like a historical epilogue to **Jeremiah**, it also records a number of prophecies, dealing with:

- **⊃** Those seeking refuge in Egypt (42:7-44:30)
- **○** Baruch, his secretary (45:1-5) the shortest chapter in **Jeremiah**
- **Egypt (46:1-26)**
- **⊃** Philistia (47:1-7)
- **⇒** Moab (48:1-47)
- **⇒** Ammon (49:1-6)
- ⇒ Edom (49:7-22) this prophecy parallels the book of Obadiah
- **⊃** Damascus (49:23-27)
- ➤ Kedar and Hazor (49:28-33)
- **⊃** Elam (49:34-39)

**⊃** Babylon (**50:1-51:64**)

The final words of Jeremiah are a prophecy against Babylon itself, the tool that God used to bring judgment against his people. It is likely that **51:64**, which says, "The words of Jeremiah end here," was written by the compiler of **Jeremiah**.

The last chapter is an appendix to the book. Like **Kings** and **Chronicles**, it is based on the archival records available to the editor. Nobody knows who this final editor was, but Baruch is a likely candidate.

Let's now complete our study of the book of Jeremiah, reading chapters 39-52.

#### **Your Fishing Kit**

This is the fifth verse in your fishing kit. **Romans 3:23** is one of the most important verses in your Fishing Kit, for it describes the condition of every single person. This is the reason we are perishing (**John 3:16**) and why we need forgiveness and redemption (**Ephesians 1:7-8**). It also puts everyone in the same boat. The Bible says that *all* have sinned. Not just some. Not just the bad ones. This is a universal condition. We have *all* sinned and fallen short of the glory (high standard) of God.
